Scholarship Description

Westbank First Nation (WFN) recognizes the importance of education in the pursuit of career goals, personal development, and the building of capacity in our community.

FortisBC Energy Inc. (FortisBC) has forged a strong, mutually beneficial relationship of trust with Westbank First Nation (WFN) through the establishment of long-term agreements with WFN. In recognition of this relationship, FortisBC has established a **Community Education Awards Program** for WFN Members who are committed to building a better future for themselves through post-secondary educational studies in disciplines relevant to the academic, trades, technology, and/or the energy sector in occupations pertinent to FortisBC operations. One of these awards is the FortisBC Post-Secondary Community Education Scholarship, with a value of \$1,500. Subject to the provisions of Policy 2015-20 Scholarships and Bursaries, WFN, in coordination with FortisBC, will award two (2) of these scholarships annually to the successful candidates.

The application period for this Scholarship opens on siyaʔtən/June 1 and closes at 4:30 p.m. Pacific Standard Time (PST) on August 10. If August 10 falls on a weekend or statutory holiday, the closing date is extended to 4:30 p.m. PST on the next business day.

The FortisBC Community Education Awards will be awarded by the end of skaytan/October.

Eligibility Criteria:

Applicants must:

- Be a WFN Member.
- Be enrolled in and currently attending an Accredited Post-Secondary Institution (an accredited public post-secondary institution, a private post-secondary institution that is registered through the Private Career Training Institute Agency British Columbia, or an international post-secondary institution) on a full- or part-time basis.
- Be in good academic standing, maintaining a minimum average of C+ or 2.5 GPA (Grade Point Average), and demonstrate a high ethical standard of responsibility as a student.
- Demonstrate community involvement and contribution.
- Be in compliance with Policy 2015-49 Accounts Receivable.
- Demonstrate financial need.
- Complete and submit the FortisBC Post-Secondary Community Education Scholarship Application by 4:30 p.m. PST on August 10 (The deadline is extended to 4:30 p.m. PST on the next business day if August 10 falls on a weekend or statutory holiday.) The application must include:
 - Your official college or university transcript, including current proof of enrollment.
 - Proof that you are a student in good standing, not on academic probation, and without any outstanding fees.
 - One academic reference letter to comment on your capability, commitment to your studies, and career goal (include names, telephone numbers & relationship/position).
 - An essay written by you outlining your goals for post-secondary studies and career plans, and summarizing your community involvement.

Preference will be given to students in disciplines related to academic, trades, technology, or energy sector occupations pertinent to FortisBC operations.
